FHPS Students participate in world-renowned ICAS Assessment

Students from FHPS who participated in the 2023 ICAS English, Mathematics and Science Assessments are to be congratulated on their achievements. A total of thirty-seven students from Year 2 - Year 6 participated in one or more of the assessments, with outstanding performers receiving certificates of Merit, Credit and Distinction.

Developed for students in primary and secondary school years, ICAS assesses the higher order thinking and problem-solving skills needed for success in English, Mathematics and Science. Results are compared with all Australian students in the same year level who participated in the assessments.

We are exceptionally proud of all the students who participated in one or more of the ICAS assessments.

All FHPS students who participated in ICAS were presented with their certificates at our school assembly on Friday October 13.

STUDENT ARRIVAL AND COLLECTION DETAILS

All students are to be dropped at their classroom at 5:30pm for a 6pm start.

Students are to come dressed in the basic costume requirements listed for their year level. Any additional costumes will be put on in the classroom.

Teachers will have activities organised for the students while waiting for their performance. **Please** make sure your child has a water bottle. Students should be given a light snack before arriving at school. No food or other items are to be brought to the classrooms.

Students are to be collected from their classroom at the end of the concert. Teachers will mark students off the roll. Parents will need to provide written permission to the class teacher if their child is to be collected by a someone other than themselves.

Families are asked to respect all audience members and performers by remaining seated for the duration of the concert. Students are not to be collected early.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE ARRANGEMENTS

If your child will be in after school care at 5:30pm on the evening of the concert, please provide OSHC with written permission to sign your child out of the program and deliver them to their classroom. Students can be collected from their classroom at the end of the concert by their parents.

VENUE ACCESS ARRANGEMENTS

The main carpark gates will be locked and not accessible. Families can enter through the pedestrian gates on Kalmia, Robina and Heatherhill roads. Please observe all onsite signage, as some areas will be blocked off for student access to the stage area.

SEATING FOR FAMILIES

Families are invited to bring a picnic rug to sit on the synthetic turf area. This area has been set aside for picnic rugs only. No chairs, prams or other items that will obscure the performance are permitted in this area.

Limited seating will be available for families on the basketball court. Chairs cannot be reserved. 'First in best dressed' will apply. A space will be set aside in this area for wheelchairs. If this is required for a family member or friend, please inform the office by Friday October 27.


Families are welcome to bring their own chairs to sit behind the seated area on the basketball court or the asphalt area between the Prep building and basketball court.

FHPS 2023 SCHOOL CONCERT SEATING PLAN




ENTRY TO FHPS

PAYMENT METHODS AT FHPS

Frankston Heights Primary School encourages families to use the below methods of payment for excursions, events and purchasing items via the school office. These methods of payment ensure there is a two-way record system for all payments made.

BPAY

Specific BPAY details are allocated to each family. These can be obtained from the school office and may be used for any payments throughout your family's time at Frankston Heights PS. Please write on permission slips if you have paid via BPAY prior to handing them in at school.

EFTPOS

EFTPOS facilities are available via the school office. Parents are able to attend the office to pay via EFTPOS in person or phone the school office on 9783 4988 and pay over the phone. Please bring the appropriate permission slips when making payments via EFTPOS in person.

CSEF

Camps, Sports and Excursions Funds are allocated to eligible families holding a Health Care/Pension card upon application. If you hold a Health Care or Pension card or are fostering a child, please speak to the school office to apply for these funds.

CENTREPAY

Frankston Heights Primary School offers Centrepay as a method of payment. Centrepay allows deductions directly from your Centrelink payments which can be used to pay for school items such as books, essential parent payments, incursions/ excursions, camps and other essential items.

ACCOUNT CREDIT

Families are welcome to make deposits into their school account at any time. Deposits can be made via EFTPOS or BPAY. These deposits will be held as credits for families to use for excursions, camps etc. Making regular small deposits help families to keep on top of their school finances.

Free home-based assessment and treatment for 7 to 12 year old children with fear and anxiety disorders.

Does your child become very afraid of certain situations or objects, worry about a lot of things. get very distressed, or try to avoid things they fear?

About the study

Our team at Griffith University may be able to assist you. We are conducting a nationwide study that includes the following services at no cost to families:

- · A thorough assessment of your child's anxiety with a trained psychologist via the telephone;
- Your child receiving one of two kinds of homebased treatments delivered on a PC. laptop or
- · Two follow-up telephone assessments with a trained psychologist 6- and 12-months after treatment to track your child's progress.

The study aims to find out if these two treatments are as effective as each other, and which children have the best response to each kind of treatment. This will mean that there are more evidence-based treatments available for helping anxious children.

About the treatments

Each treatment involves your child completing treatment sessions at home on a PC, laptop or tablet.

Each treatment involves your child learning practical strategies to better manage anxiety.

- · One treatment helps children learn to control the focus of their attention on helpful things around them.
- . The other treatment beins children learn to think differently and approach things they fear.

Each treatment includes information, telephone or email support for parents in assisting their child to better manage anxiety.

Prior studies have shown that children who complete each treatment experience significant reductions

This study is being funded by the National Health and Medical Research Council and is led by Professor Allison Waters and a team of experts in childhood
