Dear Frankston Heights Primary School community,

As the year draws to a close, we inevitably say goodbye to those students and staff who move on to new challenges; be it in high school, new employment or retirement. They are our community, so we wish them all the best in the knowledge FHPS has worked to prepare them as well as possible.

This year it is particularly significant we pause to acknowledge and celebrate the service of our FHPS Principal; Mrs Cheryl Clarke as she moves into well-deserved retirement.

The modern Primary School Principal in Victoria has many, consistently evolving criteria to fulfil and even more markers for success or failure in their tenure in the role. The role has never been more demanding, more scrutinised or more valued to a school community. It's unpredictable and unrelenting.

Perhaps an example of these qualities were most clearly defined during the challenges of the protracted COVID Pandemic response. Not just in the wisdom of taking the advice of the CHO and Ed Dept and interpreting them for the school community but in the humility she demonstrated in constantly assessing and adjusting along the way. Not many would know of the toll it took on her, on her family – the sacrifices she willingly made to consult, make decisions (however unpopular) and then wear the inevitable criticism, re-assess, adjust and go again. 

2023 Semester 2 student reports will be published to the Sentral Portal on Monday December 18. To access your **child's** 2023 Semester 2 report follow the steps below.


• Log onto the **FHPS portal** via the school website (Select the tab titled SENTRAL at the bottom of the home page).



- Enter your unique access details (login name and password) and select the Login tab.
- From your home page go to the left hand menu and select the tab with your child's name.
- On your child's home page select the **Academic Reports** tab under your child's photograph.
- Select the 2023 FHPS Student Reports Sem 2 link and the report will display.
- To download and save the report select the download icon, to print the report select the print icon.

PLEASE NOTE: Parents are advised to download and save all documents in the Published Reports section. Parents of students in Year 6 will not be able to access their child's Sentral account once the 2024 school year commences.

Frankston Heights Primary School encourages families to use the below methods of payment for excursions, events and purchasing items via the school office. These methods of payment ensure there is a two-way record system for all payments made.

BPAY

Specific BPAY details are allocated to each family. These can be obtained from the school office and may be used for any payments throughout your family's time at Frankston Heights PS. Please write on permission slips if you have paid via BPAY prior to handing them in at school.

EFTPOS

EFTPOS facilities are available via the school office. Parents are able to attend the office to pay via EFTPOS in person or phone the school office on 9783 4988 and pay over the phone. Please bring the appropriate permission slips when making payments via EFTPOS in person.

CSEF

Camps, Sports and Excursions Funds are allocated to eligible families holding a Health Care/ Pension card upon application. If you hold a Health Care or Pension card or are fostering a child, please speak to the school office to apply for these funds.

CENTREPAY

Frankston Heights Primary School offers Centrepay as a method of payment. Centrepay allows deductions directly from your Centrelink payments which can be used to pay for school items such as books, essential parent payments, incursions/excursions, camps and other essential items.

ACCOUNT CREDIT

Families are welcome to make deposits into their school account at any time. Deposits can be made via EFTPOS or BPAY. These deposits will be held as credits for families to use for excursions, camps etc. Making regular small deposits help families to keep on top of their school finances.
