Students are advised to bring their money in a purse/wallet and a bag for the storage and handling of their purchased gift.



#### 2025 Year 2-6 International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS)

Every year FHPS provides students in Years 2-6 with the option of participating in the worldrenowned International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) in English, Mathematics and Science. ICAS is an online academic competition that is designed to assess students' higher order thinking and problem-solving skills

Students who participate are celebrated and recognised with a printed certificate in each subject area, and an online results report to track development. Top performers are eligible for one of the highly coveted ICAS medals.

- Select the ICAS test(s) you wish to purchase
- Select proceed

- Make payment (you will receive an order confirmation email, keep this for your records)

**IMPORTANT:** Please enter your child's name accurately into the system. The details you enter are the details that will appear on your child's ICAS certificate.

Online payment closes Monday 28th July 2025.
