

What happens in a Three Way Conference?

Student Three-Way Conferences provide a valuable opportunity for students to take the lead in sharing their learning journey. Guided by the classroom teacher, each student leads a conversation about their achievements, progress, and areas for growth. Work samples are shared to support student reflections and highlight key learning experiences.

Parents and carers engage in the discussion, ask questions, and provide feedback. Teachers clarify and elaborate on student learning. Three way conferences play an important role in developing student agency and strengthening the partnership between home and school.

Who attends the Three Way Conference?

The student, parents/carers and the class teacher.

Why Three Way Conferences?


Three-Way Conferences:

- support the development of important organisational and oral communication skills

Follow the steps below to book your parent-teacher meeting.


Go to FHPS website and click on the SENTRAL link at the bottom of the home page

- Click on the PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEW tab on your home page or the INTERVIEW tab on the app.
- Select the tab titled '2025 Semester 1 Three-Way Conferences'
- Select TIMESLOTS
- Select the time you would like to schedule for your Three Way Conference (available timeslots are in black, unavailable in grey)
- A message will appear confirming your booking. Select SAVE BOOKING.
- Your appointment time will be displayed. Please take note of the date and time.

2025 Year 2-6 International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS)

Every year FHPS provides students in Years 2-6 with the option of participating in the worldrenowned International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) in English, Mathematics and Science. ICAS is an online academic competition that is designed to assess students' higher order thinking and problem-solving skills

Students who participate are celebrated and recognised with a printed certificate in each subject area, and an online results report to track development. Top performers are eligible for one of the highly coveted ICAS medals.

The 2025 online ICAS assessments will be held at Frankston Heights Primary School on:

English	Monday August 11	\$20.95 (Inc. GST)
Science	Monday August 18	\$20.95 (Inc. GST)
Mathematics	Tuesday August 26	\$20.95 (Inc. GST)

The school encourages you to consider entering your child into ICAS this year. The assessments are suitable for students in Years 2-6 wishing to extend and challenge themselves academically.

- Enter student details and click SAVE STUDENT
- Select the ICAS test(s) you wish to purchase
- Select proceed
- · Go to the checkout
- Make payment (you will receive an order confirmation email, keep this for your records)

IMPORTANT: Please enter your child's name accurately into the system. The details you enter are the details that will appear on your child's ICAS certificate.

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
