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ONLINE PARENT PERMISSIONS – SENTRAL

Over the past week, Frankston Heights Primary School has shared our annual online permission forms with families via the Sentral Parent Portal. Thank you to the many families who have already completed these. If you haven't yet had a chance, we kindly ask that you do so as soon as possible to support our learning programs and student records.

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES ACCEPTABLE USE AGREEMENT (AUA)

Parents/Carers are asked to read and discuss this agreement with their child. To confirm acceptance of the student expectations, both the Parent/Carer and the Student are required to select 'YES' on Sentral. Once accepted by both parties, students will be able to access digital technologies at FHPS.

PHOTOGRAPHY, FILMING AND RECORDING – PARENT CONSENT

Throughout the school year, FHPS staff may photograph, film or record students participating in school activities and events, including classroom learning, sporting events, performances, excursions and camps. Parents/Carers are asked to read the consent information attached to the activity permission on Sentral and indicate their preference by selecting 'YES' or 'NO' for each category listed.

Frankston Heights Primary Emergency Management Procedures

FHPS has an emergency management plan in place for a range of hazards, including, but not limited to, severe weather, medical emergencies, building fire and intruders. Specific response procedures have been developed to address perceived risks.

Drills are conducted throughout the year to ensure our core procedures of on-site and off-site evacuation, shelter-in-place and lockdown/lockouts are well-rehearsed and understood by staff and students.

In the event FHPS needs to enact our emergency management plan, Sentral will be used to communicate updates and actions to families, under the direction of the on-site emergency services. In the event of an emergency situation, please do not come to the school unless directed to do so, as you may put yourself and others in danger.

During an emergency, the school will work closely with emergency services to get specific advice to keep our community safe. Additionally, the Department of Education has dedicated emergency management staff to help monitor the situation and provide additional support to schools during emergencies.

Please be assured our top priority is the safety of our students and school community.

NOTE: DET provide schools with updates and advise schools when serious weather conditions or emergencies arise that may require cancellations of excursions, camps etc.

This term FHPS will conduct an on-site evacuation drill as part of the school's emergency management plan. The purpose of the drill is for staff, students and onsite visitors to practise how to evacuate in case of an emergency situation. Prior to the drill, students will participate in a preparation circle to discuss and reinforce evacuation procedures and behaviour expectations.




